EPIPHANY: A SEASON OF LIGHT AND REVELATION

As we step into the new year, the church calendar brings us to the season of Epiphany, a time filled with wonder, reflection, and revelation. Beginning on January 6, Epiphany commemorates the visit of the Magi to the Christ child, symbolizing the manifestation of Jesus as the Savior of the world. (We will celebrate Epiphany Eve on January 5th.)

The word "Epiphany" means "appearance" or "manifestation," and during this season, we are invited to reflect on how God reveals himself to us. The story of the Magi reminds us that God's love extends beyond boundaries, calling people of every nation and background to the light of Christ. The star that led the wise men to Bethlehem serves as a powerful symbol of this divine guidance, urging us to seek and follow God's presence in our own lives.

Epiphany is also a time to celebrate light. In the darkness of winter, the season shines as a reminder that Jesus is the Light of the World, bringing hope, joy, and peace. Many traditions mark this time with candle-light, star processions, and blessings of homes to reflect this theme of illumination and divine revelation. How can we live out the spirit of Epiphany in our daily lives? Here are a few ideas:

Seek God's Light: Take time for prayer, Scripture reading, and meditation to attune your heart to God's guidance.

Be a Light to Others: Perform acts of kindness and generosity, reflecting God's love to those around you.

Embrace Revelation: Stay open to new ways God may be speaking to you, whether through worship, relationships, or moments of quiet reflection.

As we journey through this beautiful season, may the light of Christ shine brightly in our hearts and lives, leading us to deeper faith and love. Let us follow the example of the Magi, who, with open hearts and eager spirits, sought and celebrated the presence of our Savior.

Applying Bible Principles

"When anyone is joined to Christ, he is a new being; the old is gone, the new has come" (2 Cor. 5:17). Christians should have a different outlook on life, including money and material possessions. They realize that they own nothing, that everything they have belongs to God, and that they are only managers and stewards of what God has entrusted to them. Because of that, Christians should have a different attitude towards "things."

That attitude demonstrates itself in many different ways. For example, Christians show mercy and give, in contrast to the those who borrow and do not repay (Psalm 37:21). Christians should hold possessions with an open hand, and "refresh" others with their bounty (Proverbs 11:24-25). They are honest and demonstrate their faith by their work and integrity (1 Thes.4:11-12). They give to those in need and thereby demonstrate to a watching world the love of God (1 John 3:17).

When this kind of lifestyle is present in our lives, Jesus said that people will see our good works, our different attitude and perspective, and will glorify our heavenly Father (Matt. 5:16). And as we seek His kingdom first and foremost, we have His promise that He will provide what we need (Matt. 6:33).

As others observe you and your lifestyle, do they see any difference because of your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ? As they observe your relationship to "things," especially to money, do they realize you are a manager, a steward, and not an owner? Or stated another way, is the manner in which you handle money and material possessions a testimony to your faith in Christ?


